

Preparing for Nursing/Midwifery university interviews

Almost all universities will do some form of interview for Nursing and Midwifery courses. MMIs are increasingly common, but if the course you're applying for does a 'standard' interview they will be looking for similar values you'd demonstrate in MMIs.

Multiple Mini Interviews (MMI)

These are unique to healthcare interviews and consist of 5-6 interview 'stations', each lasting between 5-8 minutes. It's likely these may be online this year. They are designed to test your suitability for a healthcare career – so make sure to demonstrate that you possess the 6 Cs: care, compassion, competence, communication, courage, and commitment.
