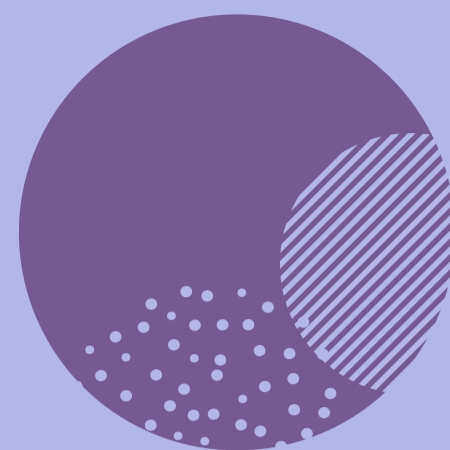

£18k per annum
