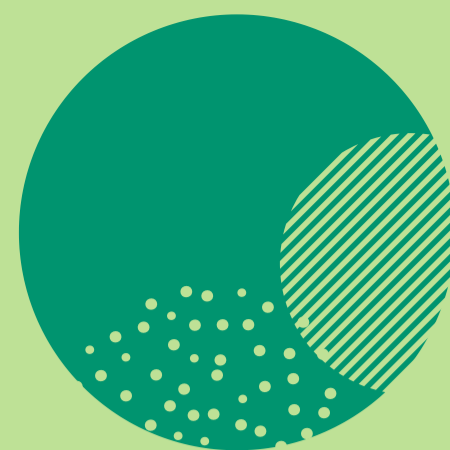
You could study...

Some education degrees will have a placement involved which is a good way to gain experience. Remember that to qualify as a secondary teacher, you should first get a degree in another subject (like English, History, Maths) and then complete a PGCE.

Apprenticeships

You could pursue these kinds of apprenticeships after your Access course

Children, Young People and Families Practitioner Apprenticeship Level 4 (Higher National Certificate)

£19k per annum

Early Years Lead Practitioner Apprenticeship Level 5 (Higher National Diploma)

£21k per annum

Chartered Manager Level 6 (Degree with honours)

£20k-£21k per annum

Digital and Technology Solutions Professional Apprenticeship Level 6 (Degree with honours)

£22k per annum
