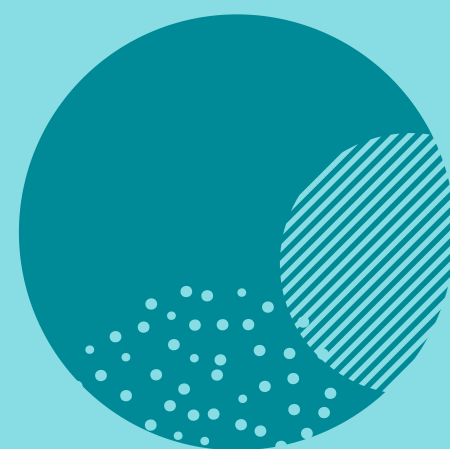

Remember, these skills are always worth mentioning in a personal statement, job application, or interview.



Some social sciences courses will have a placement year or the opportunity to study abroad - this is worth considering when applying. Remember, many subjects in the social sciences are offered as 'joint honours' so you can pick two subjects to study.

Project Management Apprenticeship Level 4 (Higher National Certificate)

£18-20k per annum

Chartered Manager Level 6 (Degree with honours)

£20k-£21k per annum

Digital and Technology Solutions Professional Apprenticeship Level 6 (Degree with honours)

£22k per annum
